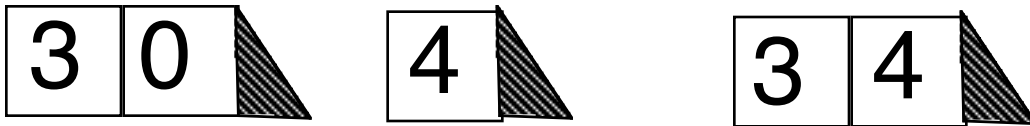


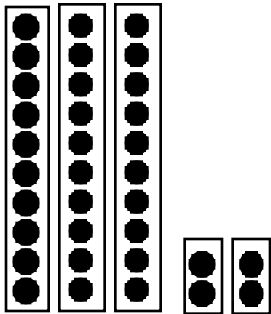
Arrow Cards

Tens/Ones: This is for a group of two. One student has the tens strips (9 tens, 1 five, 1 three, 2 twos, 1 one.) the other student has the arrow cards.

To Play: Student with the arrow cards makes a number such as 34.



Player two then uses the tens strips to represent that number.



Then Player two creates a number with the tens strips for player one to make with the numbers.

Extension: Use hundreds and thousands as appropriate.

Hundreds, Tens, Ones: Ten Minute Math(Whole Class): Working in groups of three, have each child represent one place. Using the large arrow cards, call out a number. The students work together to create that number.

Who Has? Whole Class: Pass out the large arrow cards. Write a number on the board such as 2, 674. Have the students holding the 2000, 600, 70 and 4 come to the front of the room to show its parts.
